

# GATES OF CSOMA

This exhibition is dedicated to the memory of the eminent Hungarian Indologist **Alexander Csoma de Körös** (1784-1842), who lived in Kolkata and worked in the Asiatic Society during the last ten years of his life in the 1830s, and compiled the world's first Tibetan-English dictionary. The exhibition also pays tribute to Rabindranath Tagore, who visited Hungary in 1926 and was a great admirer of Hungarian culture.
